This is a list of the year-to-date Greek Sector crimes (in descending date order):

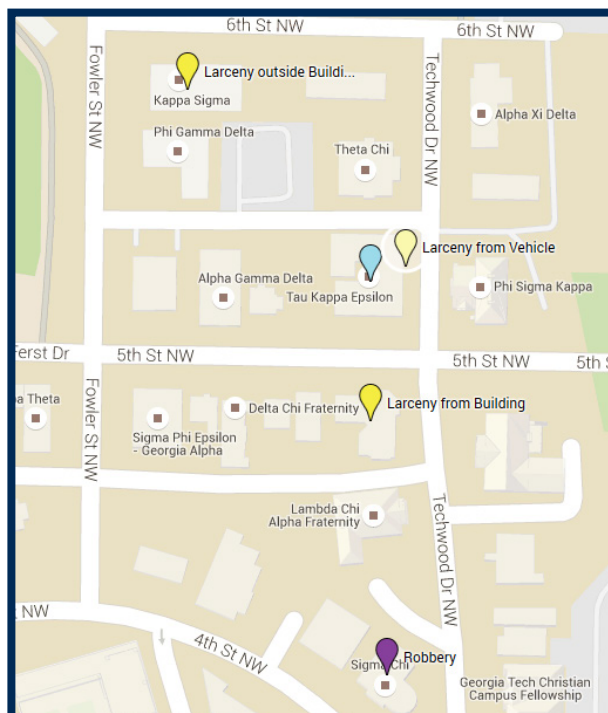
- Delta Upsilon: 154 Fifth Street NW, Larceny from Building (Fri, Feb 12 - Sat, Feb 13)
- Kappa Sigma: 182 Sixth Street NW, Larceny outside Building (Fri, Feb 5 - Sat, Feb 6)
- Sigma Chi: 770 Techwood Drive NW - sidewalk, Robbery (Fri, Jan 22)
- Tau Kappa Epsilon: 159 Fifth Street NW, Larceny from Vehicle (Dec 13 - Jan 6)
- Tau Kappa Epsilon: 159 Fifth Street NW, Theft of Service - taxi fare, (Jan 3)

Greek Sector crimes by Crime Type:

- 1 robbery
- 3 larcenies (1 from inside a Greek house, one from outside, and one from a vehicle)
- 1 theft of service)

Greek Sector crimes by Day of Week: Except for one that occurred sometime over the Winter Break (exact day unknown), these all occurred on a Friday, Saturday, or Sunday.

Greek Sector crimes by Time of Day: The majority occurred within a narrow time span between 11:45pm and 2:30am.
